Planning Manager, Niagara County Department of Economic Development

Prior to joining the Department of Economic Development fifteen years ago, Ben worked in the Office of Strategic Planning at the City of Buffalo, where he helped implement the management accountability program CitiStat Buffalo, overseeing the development and analysis of performance metrics for city department operations.

Jocelyn Gordon has served as the first Executive Director of the Buffalo Erie Niagara Land Improvement Corporation (BENLIC) since 2014. As one of New York State's ten original Land Banks, BENLIC has grown exponentially over the last seven years and returned more than 150 properties to productive use throughout Erie County.

Jocelyn holds both a master's degree in urban planning from the University at Buffalo and a master's degree in business administration from Canisius College. Her experience includes more than two decades as an urban planning consultant shaping revitalization efforts throughout the United States, Canada, and the Middle East.

ANDREA KLYCZEK

Executive Director, Niagara Orleans Regional Land Improvement Corporation (NORLIC) and Assistant Director, Niagara County Industrial Development Agency (NCIDA)

Andrea Klyczek is the Assistant Director of the Niagara County Industrial Development Agency (NCIDA) and the Executive Director of the Niagara Orleans Regional Land Improvement Corporation (NORLIC). Andrea has spent ten years with the NCIDA; during her tenure, she has been responsible for leading numerous economic development projects which have yielded significant job creation and new capital investment in the county. Andrea has overseen the buildout and development of Vantage International Point, a 158-acre industrial park.

With build out completed at the NCIDA park, Andrea turned her focus to the creation of the Niagara Orleans Regional Land Improvement Corporation (NORLIC). NORLIC is a municipal partnership that works with communities to acquire vacant and abandoned properties, with an emphasis on industrial land. In her capacity as Executive Director, Andrea has overseen the establishment of the Corporation and its mission statement and continues to contribute leadership and perspective to the direction of the organization going forward.

KATE LOCKHART

Vacant and Abandoned Property Program Director, Western New York Law Center (WNYLC)

Kate Lockhart is the Vacant and Abandoned Property Program Director at the Western New York Law Center (WNYLC). She tracks and analyzes data relating to foreclosure filings as well as incomplete, or "zombie," foreclosures in Erie and Niagara counties, and works with municipalities to identify and implement solutions for vacant and abandoned properties. She also chairs the Distressed Properties Task Force, a collaboration of local not for profits, government entities, community groups, and local officials, organized by the WNYLC, that meet to discuss the issues and solutions for vacant and abandoned properties in the City of Buffalo. Kate has held several positions during her time at the WNYLC, including Paralegal and Data Manager, and originally joined the WNYLC as an AmeriCorps VISTA volunteer.

Kate holds a bachelor's degree in history and political science.

CHIP NOLAN

Assistant Vice President and Property Preservation Lead, M&T Bank

Chip Nolan is an Assistant Vice President and Program Lead for Property Preservation at M&T Bank. He is a member of the Erie County Zombie Property Task Force and Buffalo Distressed Properties Task Force, and has been appointed to the Monroe County Vacant Property Advisory Committee. Chip also co-founded the New York Mortgage Bankers Association Loan Servicing Committee and chairs its "Boots on the Ground" subcommittee, which promotes collaboration and communicates best practices with local Mortgage Bankers Associations, and identifies local issues related to vacant and abandoned properties and mortgaged properties in New York State.

Chip is passionate about improving communities through active public/private partnerships with state and local leaders, code enforcement, consumer advocacy groups, and the NYS Department of Financial Services.

Executive Director, Lumber City Development Corporation (LCDC) and Director of Community Development, City of North Tonawanda

Michael Zimmerman is the Executive Director of Lumber City Development Corporation (LCDC), and the Director of Community Development for the City of North Tonawanda. During his ten years working in North Tonawanda, Michael has directed a wide variety of economic development, planning, and community development initiatives for the City. Under his direction, LCDC has focused on developing "downtown" North Tonawanda into a thriving tourist and entertainment district with an emphasis on historic preservation, adaptive reuse, and small business development. This has included managing over \$11 million in public grant funds, a revolving loan fund, business assistance programs, and public infrastructure projects.
