

What is a Hazard Mitigation Plan

A hazard mitigation plan:

increases awareness of hazard risks

identifies actions to reduce risks

focuses resources on the greatest risks to limit the impact of disasters.

KEY FACTS

Required to receive FEMA funding for hazard mitigation actions

Must be **updated every 5 years,** Niagara County's last HMP was approved in 2017

NYS is transforming the local HMP process by using a statewide online, interactive tools to update county plans

New plan **needs to meet new requirements** from FEMA and NYS on HMPs



What goes into a Hazard Mitigation Plan?



Identify the characteristics and potential consequences of hazards, and which communities and assets are vulnerable.



Develop a Mitigation Strategy

Set priorities, long-term strategies, and specific actions to minimize hazard impacts.



Adopt and Implement the Plan

Local jurisdictions adopt the plan and work with partners to implement mitigation actions.

How will Niagara County Inform the new Hazard Mitigation Plan?



Government representatives from Niagara County and municipalities provide project oversight and assistance with outreach and implementation



Community Meetings

Community members weigh in and help set priorities for hazard mitigation at a project kick-off and a draft plan review meeting



Stakeholder Workshops and Interviews


Focused sessions with stakeholders from each municipality to drill down on specific topics and understand local concerns

Key Terms for a Hazard Mitigation Plan



Hazard Risks

Likelihood of a hazard occurring and the expected impact it would have on people, services, facilities, and structures in a community.



Hazard Vulnerability

Limited capacity for the social, built, or natural environment to handle, avoid, or recover from hazard impacts.



Mitigation

Taking action to reduce the loss of life, personal injury, and property damage that may be caused by hazards.










Where should future hazard mitigations be prioritized?


Keg Creek - lots of flooding risk due to excessive debris, no maintenance has been performed on parts of the creek system in over 50 years
